Executive Summary

The National Health Insurance Program (NHIP) was etablished with a fundamental mandate of providing health insurance coverage for all Filipinos. It draws inspiration from the concept of social solidarity wherein the health subsidizes the sick and the rich supports the poor. This is best exemplified by the Filipino trait of "bayanihan" wherein a community is brought together to achieve a particular goal.

As the lead implementer of the NHIP, PhilHealth was tasked with the enrolment of all Filipinos to the program within the next three years. However, the responsibility of successfully implementing the program and bringing about universal health care is not PhilHealth's obligation alone. Other stakeholders include the Department of Health (DOH), the Local Government Units (LGUs), the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), other government agencies and private institutions (i.e. hospitals and companies), among others.

Efforts

1. Enrolment

- PhilHealth is working with the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) for the identification of the poorest of the poor families through the latter's National Household Targeting System for Poverty Reduction (NHTS-PR);
- An allotment of Php3.5B from the National Government was received as premium subsidy for indigent families (Php3 billion) and small entrepreneurs, underground economy workers of the informal sector (Php500 million);
- PhilHealth Board of Directors approved several resolutions to jump start activities on the coverage of the poor:
 - O PBR No.1417, s-2010: To ensure that the program is extended to those who need it most, the PhilHealth Board approved the adoption of the DSWD's NHTS-PR in the identification of indigent families to be enrolled under the Sponsored Program of NHIP
 - o *PBR No.1478, s-2011*: Approval of special contribution rates for CY2011 on the enrolment of households identified by the NHTS-PR (zero pesos LGU counterpart contribution)¹
 - o *PBR No.1479, s-2011*: Coverage of small-scale entrepreneurs, underground economy workers of the informal sector (partial subsidy)

Other initiatives

- O Conducted a Nationwide PhilHealth Registration Day on October 2, 2010 as kick-off to speed up registration and updating of Membership Database
- PhilHealth AKO program (Advocate and Knowledge Officers): training of Barangay Health Workers (BHWs) all over the country to disseminate information about PhilHealth
- O Strengthening of group enrolment for the informal sector
- o Establishment of PhilHealth Call centers (in the regions)
- o Online inquiry system
- O Legislative amendments on the NHIP law
- O Networking with LGUs and other organizations

¹ Premium contribution for the sponsored program members is shared by the National Government through the general appropriation while the local chief executives (LGUs) pay the other half
