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## Clarification on Some Patient Care Indicators in the Benchbook Standards for Hospitals

In order to have a common understanding of the Benchbook Standards, indicators and evidences in the area of patient care, the following clarifications are hereby issued:

| 2.2.3.a.2<br>All patients are correctly<br>identified by their charts            | Patient chart from ER, ward, OPD<br>and ICU verified with patient if he/<br>she really is the person indicated in<br>the chart   | This means that all patients <b>must</b><br>have medical records or charts<br>including newborn infants whether<br>he/she is roomed in or not   |
| 2.2.3.b.1<br>Percentage of charts with<br>unique identifiers for each<br>patient | Patient chart from ER, OPD, wards<br>and ICU<br>Note: Review patient's chart and<br>look for patient's complete name,<br>address, birthday, demographic data<br>(sex, age, civil status) and hospital<br>number. For newborns, look for<br>parents' names and <b>footprint of the</b><br><b>baby</b> , attending physician, room<br>number | Footprint of the baby is given as<br>an example of how to uniquely<br>identify a newborn. The current<br>standard of practice in<br>identification of newborn is<br><b>placing an identification band</b><br>usually in the ankle with the name<br>of the mother, sex of the baby,<br>name of phsyician of the baby,<br>date and time of delivery. The<br>same information is also written in<br>the chart. This current practice is<br>also an acceptable method of<br>unique identification of newborn. |
