TO : ALL ACCREDITED HOSPITALS AND ALL CONCERNED

SUBJECT: Revised Survey Tools and Additional Accreditation Requirements

Due to the changes in hospital licensure requirements per Administrative Order # 147 s. 2004 as amended by Administrative Order 2005-0029 of the Department of Health the Corporation has revised the survey tools for the accreditation of hospitals at all levels. Further, since licensing requirements are minimum requirements to ensure safety and quality of health care services being rendered to members of the National Health Insurance Program, the Corporation has added the following requirements for accreditation of hospitals:

I. Personnel

A. Manpower Complement

* No Physician should go on duty for more than 48 hours

B. Exemptions

A Level 1 hospital may request for exemption from the minimum requirement of "two physicians" if they are located in the following areas:

- 1. Poor municipalities as attested by the National Statistical Coordination Board and by the National Anti-Poverty Commission;
- 2. Areas with security problems;
- Hard-to-reach areas.

In such cases the hospital shall submit to the Corporation a copy of the Memorandum of Agreement with physician-reliever in case the only physician-on-duty has to leave the hospital to ensure continuous presence of a physician in the hospital at all times.

PhilHealth surveyors must verify the request of the hospital in their respective regions before action may be undertaken by the Corporation.

II. Emergency Drugs

Listed below are the required emergency drugs in the emergency room and intensive care unit of **hospitals** in different levels. These drugs are grouped according to their mechanism of actions.
